

**Program/Event: Skin Cancer Screening – May 21, 2014**

The targeted population for this screening was uninsured and underinsured adult men and women. The recommendations for skin cancer screenings as disseminated by the American Academy of Dermatology are that patients perform a self-assessment examination of their skin and if a change is recognized, they seek medical assistance. There were 37 people who attended this screening, performed by Gavan Moniyhan, MD, with 20 community members referred for follow up, with no further follow up needed.

**Program/Event: Prostate Cancer Screening – October 1, 2014**

The targeted population was uninsured or underinsured men, age 50 and older (40 with a family history). The recommendations for prostate cancer screenings are provided by the American Cancer Society. There were 17 people who attended this screening. Of this, there were 3 referrals for follow up and referred to their private physicians with no further treatment needed.

**Program/Event: Levittown & North Babylon High School Breast Awareness Event – October 16 & 27, 2015**

The targeted population was high school seniors and their teachers. Attendees were able to state American Cancer Society's guidelines as well as two controllable/uncontrollable risk factors of breast cancer. In addition to breast health awareness, the increase risk of cancer with the association of smoking were discussed. For upcoming events, the decision was to add in mothers of these students into this educational program.

The guidelines followed were directly from the American Cancer Society. Emphasis was placed on having the students bring back this information on self-breast exams, prevention, diet and wellness to women in their families.

There were 130 attendees of this presentation, provided by Bonnie Edsall, MS, RN, CBCN, CN, BN.

**Program/Event: Palliative Care Committee Lecture – December 12, 2016**

Beyond opportunities in our community, Good Samaritan also focused on its employee population to provide educational health information for their own benefit and also, to increase referrals to the services provided by the American Cancer Society. The targeted population was Good Samaritan Hospital Social Workers and Care Managers and other nursing professionals who encompass the Palliative Care Team and have direct access to referring a cancer patient to the American Cancer Society's patient navigation services.

The guidelines for cancer patients are provided by the American Cancer Society.

There were 32 attendees to this educational event. The evaluation was measured on a Likert scale from one to four, with four being excellent. All surveys received provided results of an excellent event. Three members of this clinical team called the Breast Health Center that day to schedule a mammography. All three received their mammogram and results were to continue to have an annual mammogram.

**Program/Event: Positively Pink Health Fair, Westfield South Shore Mall – October 22, 2016**

The targeted population was local female community members in Good Samaritan's service area, with a special emphasis on those uninsured and underinsured. The guidelines for breast cancer patients are provided by the American Cancer Society.

At this educational event, 17 patients signed up to make an appointment for a screening mammogram.

- Two of the patients signed up for Cancer Services Program (CSP) to contact them for additional services. CSP made contact with the two patients.
- Two out of the 17 made appointments, were screened and no further workup was needed.
- Out of the 17 patients, 13 were called for follow ups to schedule appointments and did not respond.
